Run for Wells Lesson Plan - Grade 5 to 9 Art Contest

(Can be altered for any grade)

Grade 5 to 9 students are asked to submit a piece of two-dimensional art that reflects the goal of the Run For Wells. The winning submission will be chosen by the event's Organizing Committee with the help and influence of votes cast online at the Run For Wells website.

**THE WINNER'S ART WILL BE USED ON ALL 5K AND 10K TECHNICAL T-SHIRTS
ISSUED TO STUDENTS THAT PARTICIPATE IN THE 2011 RUN FOR WELLS RUNNING RACES.**

Intended Learning Outcomes:

- Apply creativity and imagination to visually communicate and express an important issue
- Analyze a range of problems and interpret a resolution through creative expression

Materials Needed:

- Pens, pencils or markers
- Plain white 8 by x 11 inch paper
- Digital illustration program (optional)

Suggested Activities:

1. Watch *A Thirst For Africa* or *Tessa's Letter* video.
2. Discuss and clarify the details of the Run For Wells and its goals (see *Quick Facts* below).
3. Distribute the rules and conditions to the class.
4. Get creative and have fun!

Run for Wells – Quick Facts:

- The event takes place Saturday May 28th, 2011.
- The event consists of a 5K run, a 10K run and a unique **3K Walk-With-Water**, whereby a team of up to four individuals must walk 3K while carrying a 25 pound jug of water, as women and children do on a daily basis in Africa. This fun and eye opening experience is unique to the Run for Wells, and is a great team-based activity.
- All proceeds are donated to HOPE International Development agency, which will use the funds for clean water and sanitation projects.
- HOPE's typical method of collecting water is to cap a mountain spring and direct that water into a protected reservoir. Water is then piped to one or more villages where it is available from a regular tap.
- It takes just \$35 to provide someone in Southern Ethiopia with clean water for the rest of their life.

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RULES AND CONDITIONS

COLOURS & BACKGROUND

The drawings that are created and submitted may contain up to three (3) foreground colours and one (1) background colour. The best method to draw these would be with an ink pen or pencil (ink pen is preferred), although markers can also be used. **Solid colours** should be used due to the fact that the winning image will be silkscreened onto t-shirts, any colour gradations will not be accepted.

CONTENT

The image may consist of a drawing, logo design, or symbol that is representative of the Run for Wells' cause. The submitted image should include the name of the event, "Run for Wells", and the artist has the liberty to be as creative as they like with the name placement.

NO PHOTOGRAPHS

The use of any photographic images in the entries poses copyright and reproduction challenges. For that reason, all entries are limited to line drawings and original works.

WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO ADJUST

The Run for Wells Organizing Committee reserves the right to make the final decision on the winning submission. Votes cast for each entry on the Run For Wells website will be used to influence the selection, but will not be the only factor that affects the selection process. The Run for Wells Organizing Committee reserves the right to make adjustments and alterations to the winning entry to ensure that the reproduction of the given image is as good as possible. All entries agree to these terms.

DIGITAL SUBMISSIONS

Digital entries that are submitted must be saved at a minimum of 8 by 11 inches. All files should be submitted as flattened files. Digital files can be submitted to Run for Wells on the following media: CD or DVD. Entrants will also be required to submit a colour copy to represent what has been created electronically on disc.

RETURN OF ORIGINAL ART/SIGNATURE

Art will NOT be returned. Students should sign their art and provide school and phone number on the back. The winner could be interviewed for the Burling Post.
